Fair Play is a specific approach to sport that can be taught, practiced and perfected.

Fair Play Code of Conduct for "Athletes"

- Play by the rules and spirit of the game.
- Control temper and void fighting, mouthing off, trash talking and deliberate attempts to injure.
- Strive to be a team player.
- Remember that winning isn't everything.
- Show respect for officials, coaches and opponents.
- Accept consequences for actions.

Fair Play Code of Conduct for "Coaches"

- Teach players to play fairly and to respect the rules, officials and opponents.
- Ensure all players receive equal instruction and support, not ridicule or yell at players.
- Ensure equipment and facilities are safe.
- Act as a positive role model.
- Obtain proper training as a Coach
- Effectively communicate with parents/guardians.
- Ensure acceptable locker room behaviour.
- Ensure each team member has an equal chance to play.

Fair Play Code of Conduct for Parents/Spectators

- Remember that athletes play for fun.
- Respect officials' decisions and encourage participants to do the same.
- Never ridicule players for making a mistake.
- Give positive comments to motivate and encourage.
- Condemn the use of violence.
- Show respect for opponents.
- Do not use bad language or provocative gestures.
- Do not harass players, officials or other spectators.

Fair Play Code of Conduct for Officials

- Obtain proper training and continually upgrade skills.
- Intervene in any situation that threatens the safety of players.
- Do not permit intimidation of any other player by either words or action.
- Be consistent and objective in calling all infractions.
- Handle all conflicts firmly and with dignity.
- Work in cooperation with the Coaches for the benefit of the game.
